connection with their lands.

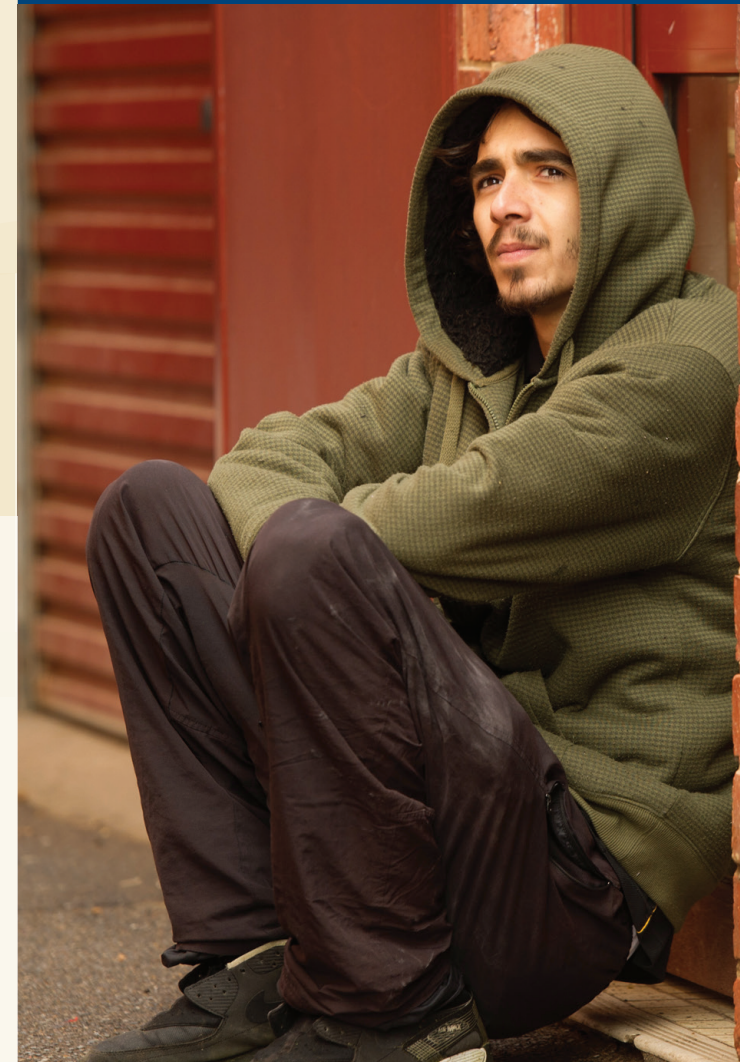

Referral Process

Young people are able to self refer, or be referred by another service from whom they are receiving support:

Outer North Youth Homelessness Service (Youth Services Barossa)

Youth Services Barossa

Youth Services Barossa provides the Outer North Youth Homelessness Service to young people aged 15-25 years who are homeless or are at risk of becoming homeless.

Case Manager works in a collaborative approach with community based services within the Barossa Council region.

Services

- Supported Tenancies and Stimulus Housing are generally allocated to young people aged over 18 who are homeless, who are at risk of becoming homeless, or whom face other barriers in accessing alternative forms of accommodation.
- Clients are allocated a case manager to provide supports, specifically around independent living skills and transitioning to independent living, which includes health and education, and connecting into community services, etc.
- Case management, support, information, advocacy and referral.
- Some capacity to provide support to eligible clients living in private rental and Housing SA properties.

Eligibility

- Young people aged 15-25 years who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless, or whom face significant barriers in accessing accommodation.
- Be receiving or awaiting approval of an independent income.
